ABOUT CUNY BACCALAUREATE FOR UNIQUE AND INTERDISCIPLINARY STUDIES

In the late 1960s, a group of faculty and students asked CUNY to allow individual faculty and students to define programs of study, with access to courses across campuses. On Feb. 22, 1971, the NYS Board of Higher Education authorized a University-wide B.A.; soon after, the B.S. was approved. First known as the CUNY Baccalaureate Program and renamed CUNY Baccalaureate for Unique and Interdisciplinary Studies in 2008, the degree is commonly called CUNY BA.

Faculty mentoring is the cornerstone. Over 400 professors mentor students as they build their individualized degrees, which have ranged from American Revolutionary History to Zoological Photography. Student-mentor opportunities have proven invaluable in the personal development of CUNY BA students, leading to independent research projects, internships, and study abroad opportunities.

CUNY BA has received grants from: the Diamond, Ford, International Study Abroad, and The William Randolph Hearst Foundations; the Council for Adult and Experiential Learning; Google, Inc.; The CUNY Consortium for the Study of Disabilities; and CUNY Workforce Development Initiative. CUNY BA was recognized by the University Design Consortium, an international organization that challenges public universities to develop innovative strategies to address complex issues, and nationally as a top military-friendly institution. In addition, CUNY BA was instrumental in CUNY receiving grants from NASA and the U.S. Department of Education for facilitating degrees in Space Science and Middle Eastern Studies.

CUNY BA has its own academic fellowship established by the Thomas W. Smith Foundation and has received a multi-million dollar bequest from the Barbara J. Price estate for fellowships. Since 1994, CUNY BA has funded over 1000 students. With the continued support of the Smith and Price funds we can increase these numbers for academically superior CUNY BA students.

Almost fifty years later, the goal of helping students and faculty pursue intellectual innovation continues. There are over 7,500 alumni; the majority report that they have received raises and promotions or have successfully changed careers, have gone on to graduate school, and are working in careers related to their self-designed studies. It's no wonder that during the program's 2010 reaccreditation, the Middle States Commission on Higher Education called CUNY BA "The gem of the University"!


