Over the years a number of students and faculty have asked for a newsletter from our office. Well, this is it. We hope we can periodically bring you information about the operation of the Program, news of internship opportunities and items of particular interest to you.

The first news is that our Director, Dr. Sheila Kaplan, has resigned to accept a position as academic vice president in the Minnesota State University System. When she became Director some six years ago there were 50 students in the Program; there are now over 1100. One of our counselors, Ms. Sara Velez, has also left to become Director of Information for the Minnesota System. She will be developing a central admissions procedure.

The Academic Office now has the following staff: Ms. Elaine Egues, Director; Mr. Jim Willard, Assistant Director; Mr. Stan Mulfeld, Counselor; and our secretaries, Mrs. Harrison and Mrs. Gershoff. We will try to provide all the services as before without delay. It will help us if, when you phone, you state your business carefully. Remember also that frequently either Mrs. Gershoff or Mrs. Harrison can help you and you needn't speak to the counseling staff.

The Records Office remains the same. Ms. Virginia Olenick will be working on graduation certificates and Ms. Diane Forst will handle other records. Any questions about registration, billings, payment, graduation, etc., are to be addressed to them at 790-4743. Ms. Roberta Zalkin oversees that office but is only available for special problem situations.

INTERNSHIPS

The N.Y.C. Cultural Affairs Arts Apprenticeship Program has several hundred openings for this fall with artists in all fields. If you are interested, contact Ms. Claire Tankel at 360-8185. Some placements may earn you money through the Urban Corps work-study program.
