## Part Way Home Initiative

UNC System 2016

#### **Goals:**

- Identify stopped-out students with significant college credits but no degree
- Determine efficient ways to find and connect with these students
- Seek feedback from students at the 6 UNC system schools' programs already serving PWH students
- Identify and decrease barriers to make it easier for students to return
- Encouraged other system schools to develop programs or initiatives to better support PWH students





## Seahawk Success Program

Began in Fall 2017


#### Reach out to students who:

- Have 70 or more credit hours earned
- Stopped-out from UNCW for at least a year
- Left in good academic and behavioral standing
- With no or manageable financial holds

#### **Benefits of Program:**

- "Concierge Advising"
- Students could meet with advisor prior to re-enrolling
- Discuss concerns related to re-enrolling
- Help decrease barriers
- Help student determine best degree pathway

## **Interdisciplinary Studies**



- Flexible degree established with support of academic departments
- Interdisciplinary philosophy increasingly necessary to solve modern societal problems
- Option to complete fully online
- Courses offered from wide range of disciplines
- First group accepted fall 2018
- 1 graduate in second year to 13 graduating this semester

### Current UNCW Students 2-year Pilot

- 100 total credit hours
- 12 credits at UNCW
- Good Academic Standing
- No stop out time
- Not seeking second bachelor's degree or second major






## **Process for Growth**
