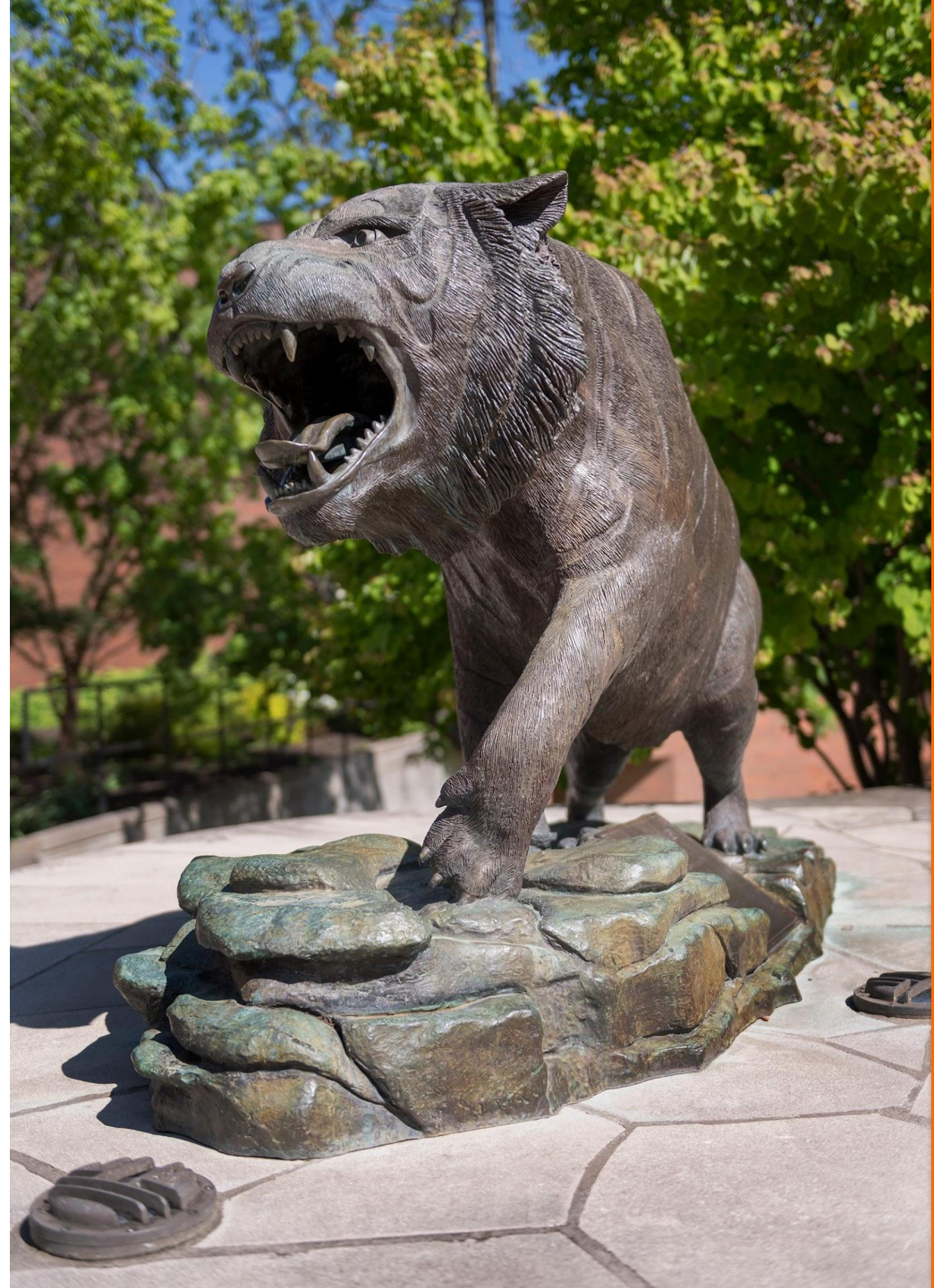

SOIS Degree Background

- Degree-granting unit at RIT (16,000+ undergraduates total)
- SOIS population: 323 undergraduates spring 2023
 - Freshman: 10%
 - Reframers: 60%
 - National Technical Institute for the Deaf
 - Completers: 30%
 - 4/5th year, Pre-professional
 - Roar to the Finish

Reframers: NTID Associate Students

- Who: National Technical Institute for the Deaf (NTID) students completing their Associate degrees
- Why Unique?
- Benefits/Challenges
 - Maximize Earned Credits
 - VR & Marketability
 - Admissions requirements

Completers: Traditional Seniors

- Who: Entry into SOIS in 4th/5th year
 - Mid to High GPA, but no longer interested in major
 - Low GPA, hit class(es) road block they cannot pass (referred)
 - Not able to secure required co-op
- Benefits/Challenges of Late Entry
 - Service to Students and Institute
 - How do we create interdisciplinary meaning?

Completers: Pre-Professional Credentials

- Pre-professional
 - Echocardiography (Cardiac Ultrasound) Certificate
 - 42 semester hours over two years (includes clinical)
 - Requires some college-level science pre-reqs
 - No joint BS degree for this specific certificate
- SOIS Degree Benefit:
 - Individual curriculum allows full transfer of certificate into BS pathway

Completers: Roar to the Finish

- What: Degree completion program that outreaches to former RIT students who left RIT without completing their bachelors degree
- Why: Decline in traditional age students enrolling in higher education, meet workforce needs, national college debt crisis
- When: Started 6 years ago and are approaching the end of the first round of outreach

Completers: Roar to the Finish

- Who: Outreach to students who completed a minimum of 75 semester hours, in good academic standing and had no financial holds
- How: Students complete through a variety of time and cost effective options including competency based education
